We would anticipate that each volunteer will need to be available for 2 hours per week. This is unpaid, but expenses will be covered.

Offending History/Criminal Record Check

Being a Safer Living Foundation volunteer can involve working with vulnerable young people and their families and/or vulnerable adults, and for that reason we are required to carry out an enhanced DBS check which includes convictions that are spent under the

Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974. Previous convictions will not automatically bar you from becoming a Circle Volunteer, but would be discussed at the interview.
